Our Staff

- **997** employees across **12** counties delivered direct services to more than **21,000** clients in **2023**



Aging Services

- **1,023** clients provided with subsidized in-home supports, transportation, care management, and other direct services



Behavioral Health

- **2,347** clients served by Outpatient Clinic
- **803** clients provided with residential drug treatment services
- **186** clients served by home and community-based mental health and outpatient supports



Community Resource Services

- **587** households provided with emergency food assistance

Coordinated Care - Chronic Illness & Traumatic Brain Injury
